Dr. Anjum Rasheed is an environmentalist working as Assistant Professor at CCRD. She received her Ph.D. degree in Environmental Sciences from Fatima Jinnah Women University, Rawalpindi, Pakistan. She has been associated with the Department of Marine, Earth and Atmospheric Sciences, North Carolina State University (NCSU) as visiting scholar for her Ph.D. research work. Her Ph.D. research focuses on ambient air quality analysis and assessment of effects of climate change on air quality in Pakistan. Dr. Anjum has worked as Research Associate, Atmosphere Initiative at the International Centre for Integrated Mountain Development (ICIMOD), Nepal. There, she worked on the projects' WRF-Chem Model Evaluation Project for Hindu Kush Himalayan Region' and 'Temporal Analysis of Black Carbon in Kathmandu Valley, Nepal'.

Before that, she was working with Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) as Chief Coordinator for 'Technical Cooperation Project for Establishment of Environmental Monitoring System in Pakistan'.
